Hello students-

Please see a message below from President Simone regarding COVID-19:

*"Western Nebraska Community College takes the health and safety of our campus communities seriously and I know you have many questions and concerns regarding COVID-19. WNCC has been meeting all week with various community stakeholders, including the Panhandle Public Health District (PPHD). We have considered numerous perspectives in our decision-making and this is a fluid, constantly evolving situation.*

*At this time, our plan is to resume classes as scheduled on Monday, March 16. I want to reassure you that we are working through this serious matter, and you will be the first to know about further response plans at WNCC."*

**According to the Panhandle Public Health District (PPHD), as of today March 12, the risk for contracting COVID-19 remains low in the Panhandle. There are no known cases at this time.**

Below is some important information you need to know now:

**Classes:** As of right now, **classes resume as scheduled on Monday, March 16.**

**Communication:** We will continue to share the latest updates with you via email and on our [website](#).

**Travel:** WNCC, in partnership with PPHD, is urging you to voluntarily disclose travel that took place outside of the Nebraska Panhandle during Spring Break. Click [here](#) to access the form.

**Evaluating Your Health:** Please **stay home, limit your contact with others**, and contact PPHD at 308-262-5764 immediately if you have the following symptoms:

- A fever above 100.4 degrees.
- Symptoms of respiratory illness, such as cough or difficulty breathing.

Additionally, you should contact PPHD if:

- You have been in close contact with a person known to have COVID-19.
- You recently traveled to an area with [ongoing spread](#).

PPHD will conduct a phone screening, and if medical attention is needed, PPHD will make arrangements for testing. **Do not go directly to a clinic or hospital. It is important that health care providers know you are coming so that proper precautions can be in place.**

**Academics:** We are strongly considering a transition of much of our instruction to an online environment. We will notify you immediately via email of any adjustments in coursework delivery methods.

To echo President Simone, I want to reassure you that we are working through this serious matter, and you will be the first to know about further response plans at WNCC.
