## Update on WNCC's Four-Year Assurance Argument and Monitoring Report

Ms. Reichert, Institutional Effectiveness and Planning Director, explained that WNCC's accreditor is the Higher Learning Commission (HLC). The HLC offers two pathways to reaffirmation of accreditation, Standard and Open. WNCC follows the Open Pathway which are ten-year cycles in which members affirm the quality of their offerings and demonstrate continuous improvement.

## Update on WNCC's Four-Year Assurance Argument and Monitoring Report

The purpose of accreditation is to validate the quality of an institution's academic programs and evaluate the quality of the institution beyond its academic offerings.

Following the WNCC four-year assurance argument, the report from the peer reviewers stated the College met the requirements of seventeen out of eighteen core components. However, the College "met with concerns" the requirements for Core Component 4.C., which states "the institution pursues educational improvement through goals and strategies to improve retention, persistence, and completion rates in its degree and certificate programs".

WNCC is in year five of the accreditation process. Years five to seven, a requirement of the open pathway is a quality initiative which is a project of our choosing. The project must be approved by HLC, and once approved, the College has four years to complete the project and report on the quality of the project. Years seven to nine is when the report is completed. Year eight, the College will have a multi-location visit. WNCC's separate locations include Alliance and Sidney, and the Powerline and Aviation facilities.

## **Report Requirements:**

- 4.C.1 explicit retention, persistence, and completion goals
- 4.C.2 specific measurements and Key Performance Indicators for the retention, persistence, and completion goals
- 4.C.2 demonstration of collected evidence which could include linking existing data
- 4.C.4 to newly defined goals and/or starting to collect new data, if needed to measure goal attainment
- 4.C.2 descriptions of how data are analyzed
- 4.C.3 recent examples of how WNCC has used data to reach informed decisions and closed the loops

#### **Routine Monitoring**

If a peer review team or a panel determines an institution is following the criteria for accreditation, but there is no concern about an institution continuing to meet the standards of the criteria, facing significant changes or challenges, or has plans that need to come to fruition, then routine monitoring can occur. WNCC currently has plans that need to come to fruition. September 1, 2026, the College monitoring report is due.
