

Admission Criteria for the Associate Degree Nursing Program Advanced Placement

Students may start applying to the Associate Degree Nursing program in September the year prior to their admission into the nursing program. The full-time Associate Degree Nursing program starts every fall in August and students will graduate in 2 semesters.

Applications must be received by May 15th the year students are applying for admission. Selection for admission is a competitive process.

Additional admission requirements

Prerequisite GPA of 3.0

- 1. Prerequisite courses must have a grade of C or higher
- 2. Completion of Entrance Exam (ATI Critical Thinking with a score of 60 or higher and HESI LPN-RN Entrance Exam of 850 or higher)
- 3. Anatomy and Physiology courses must have been taken within the last 7 years or A&P Final (See Student Nursing Handbook)
- 4. Active unencumbered LPN License.
