

WNCC Medical Laboratory Technology and **Phlebotomy Programs**

Admission Requirements

The MLT and Phlebotomy Programs are selective admissions programs, requiring an application beyond one needed for admission to WNCC. Interested students should contact the program director located in the Harms Center for more information and to obtain the Program application forms. Also, the program application forms are available on Program Webpage at WNCC.EDU

Before admission to the MLT and Phlebotomy programs, the applicant must meet the following requirements:

- Applicant must be at least 17 years of age;
- Applicant must submit an official high school transcript or GED certificate;
 Applicant must submit official college transcripts, if applicable;
- ♣ Applicants must meet certain essential functions as defined by NAACLS's Standard. Essential functions are the abilities and tasks that a student must be able to perform to be successful in the learning experiences and completion of the program. (For more details, please contact MLT/Phlebotomy Program Director);
- Applicant must fulfill Western Nebraska Community College's General Admission Requirements;
- Applicant must submit completed MLT and or Phlebotomy Program application forms and admission checklists into the Program Director via email or mail on the published deadline.
- The applicant must submit two letters of recommendation from teachers and or current employers. This is only for the MLT Program.
- Applicant must provide documentation of current immunization or proof of immunity:
- Applicant must submit a satisfactory background check result;
- Applicants must fulfill the college and program essential skills assessment score, such as the ACT, SAT, NextGen ACCUPLACER, unless exempt. Students can arrange to take the NextGen ACCUPLACER on the WNCC campus;
- ♣ The applicant must comply with the MLT and Phlebotomy Program Drug and Alcohol Screening Policy.
